Greenville Forward was formed in January 2006 to convert Vision 2025 into an operable plan that is understandable and measurable, and to build collaborations to measure the progress of the plans with groups and individuals who are held accountable for the results. Its mission is to benchmark, measure, facilitate, guide and champion the Greenville Vision 2025 goals and initiatives along with identifying and developing emerging leadership to shepherd the Vision forward.

Vision 2025 began in 2002 by a group of community leaders and Greenville citizens to establish goals for Greenville County. The 2025 process was based on a previous visioning inspired by former Mayor Max Heller, called Vision 2005. The results from that vision include, The Peace Center for the Performing Arts, The Bi-Lo Center, Falls Park on the Reedy, pedestrian Main Street, and downtown revitalization. Within Vision 2025 are 16 different task forces ranging from Internationalism to Arts. Greenville Forward’s charge is to organize each Task Force, schedule regular meetings, track the results and present an annual report card to the community on the state of the Vision.
